- 🛇 Teach them not to share personal information like their name, school, address, or photos with people online.
- 🗣 Encourage them to tell you if something online makes them feel uncomfortable or confused.
- O Set healthy screen time limits and balance digital play with offline activities.



UNICEF Rights Respecting Schools Article 38 - Protection in war

"Governments must not allow children under the age of 15 to take part in war or join the armed forces. Governments must do everything they can to protect and care for children affected by war and armed conflict."
